

## **Dance Conduct Code**

In an effort to preserve the positive nature of school events such as dances, the following guidelines have been established. If you have questions or concerns, please see Ms. Woodward. Failure to follow these guidelines could result in being asked to leave the dance without a refund or re-admittance.

## A. Dance Guidelines

- 1. ALL dancing should be face-to-face.
- 2. There should be a respectable distance between the dancers.
- 3. There will be NO grinding between the dancers. If this does occur, you will be asked to leave the dance floor and possibly the dance.
- 4. ALL Grand River Prep rules and policies apply to this event
- 5. If you need to exit the building, you must do so with advanced permission of a chaperone...you will NOT be allowed back into the dance if you leave without permission
- 6. NO inappropriate touching or public displays of affection

## B. Dress Code Guidelines (Semi-Formal Dance)

- Clothing that reveals undergarments when sitting, walking, or bending is unacceptable; undergarments are not to be displayed at any time
- Clothing that is overly revealing is inappropriate; this may include clothing that is ripped, torn, low-cut, too short, to clingy/tight
- Clothing with offensive language, demeaning words, gang affiliation, drug/alcohol ads or any obvious bad taste is not acceptable
- Shirts and tops are to be appropriately sized to the individual
- Shirts that reveal skin at the waist are not appropriate
- Shirts/dresses must not show cleavage, nor be excessively low cut
- Strapless and spaghetti strap tops are allowed, but must meet all guidelines outlined (no cleavage, no undergarments showing, not overly low-cut, etc)
- Shorts, skirts, and dresses should be no more than 2 inches above the knees and should remain no more than 2 inches above the knees at all times
- If you choose to wear shorts/leggings under your skirt or dress, the 2 inch rule still applies
- NO JEANS PLEASE!

If you have a question regarding the acceptableness of your planned attire, please see an administrator, with the attire, in advance for a judgment.

Students who are in violation of this dress code will be required to dress appropriately before being admitted to the dance.

The final judge of appropriate dress for the semi-formal dance are members of the administrative team.
